NOW THAT TWO REAL ESTATE GIANTS HAVE TEAMED UP TO CREATE **SOLÉ MIA**, ONE OF THE LARGEST INTEGRATED DEVELOPMENTS IN THE NATION, NORTH MIAMI WILL NEVER BE THE SAME.

The one name that incites trust within the upper echelons of real estate luminaries is Soffer (as in the folks behind Aventura Mall,

Turnberry Isle Miami and the soon-to-emerge Turnberry Ocean Club in Sunny Isles Beach). But when the company recently joined forces with one of the world's largest property firms, New York-based LeFrak, the Soffers' credibility grew to galactic proportions. Taking up more than 8 million square feet of land, SoLe Mia (that's "So" for Soffer, "Le" for LeFrak and "Mia" for Miami) is what

resulted from the union. The behemoth will offer 4,390 residences, with price ranges for the residential units yet

to be released (but expected to go well into the eight figures). "We've begun work on the development's infrastructure, including the spine road," says Jackie Soffer, co-chairman and CEO of Turnberry Associates. "We intend to break ground on the first residential buildings, retail complexes and the Warren Henry (Jaguar and Land Rover) auto dealership within the

next year." A high-end cinema with table service and gourmet grocery are expected, along with other commercial, retail and office spaces; an educational center; and out-of-the-box amenities, including two swimmable 10-acre lagoons. So.Le Mia's first inhabitants are expected to move in by 2018, and, like most of the Soffers' projects, this community is designed to appeal to those who like getting around by foot—yet it's anything but pedestrian. 15045
